








Into The Wild

- Be crafty: Can the children create their own 'wild thing' out of recycled packaging like cereal and egg boxes, and colourful wrappers?
- Get counting: How many owls, foxes and other creatures can the children see on each page?



Whisper, Shout: Let It Out!

Ask the children how still and silent they can be – like sleeping lions. As they sit or lie down, ask them to listen to the sounds around them. Then get them writing! Give them some paper and ask them, or the adult with them, to to list the sounds they heard when they were being quiet – could they hear themselves and others breathing, or their tummy gurgling?



LOOK OUT! Hungry Snake

 Colourful creatures: Give the children snake outlines to decorate their own way.



ROARR!

Play a game of 'I spy': What other creatures can the children spot in the book? Butterflies, ladybirds or snakes?



Ten Little Ducklings

 Treasure hunt time: Cut out egg shapes (and/or duckling outlines) and hide them around your setting. Then challenge the children to seek them out and see how many they find.
